CCHSRA TO HOLD FREE WORKSHOPS AT KIT CARSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN HANFORD SEPTEMBER 8, 10 *****

THOSE OUTSIDE KINGS COUNTY ALSO EXTENDED INVITE

Hanford, CA, September 6, 2011 -- Citizens for California High Speed Rail Accountability (CCHSRA) will host two free workshops at Kit Carson Elementary School on September 8 and 10 in Hanford, California. The CCHRSA is a nonpartisan advocacy group whose members include those who reside in the city and rural areas.

Concerned citizens in Kings County along with neighboring counties will have a welcome alternative to freely discuss and learn about issues pertaining to high-speed rail courtesy of **CCHSRA**. Those who live in counties outside the Central Valley are also welcome.

The workshop is intended to educate people on how the EIR/EIS process works and how to provide effective comments to the California High-Speed Rail Authority.

"CCHSRA is counting on the public to weigh in on this project since it is the Central Valley that's the Authority's (California High-Speed Rail) first target," said CCHSRA Co-Chair Aaron Fukuda. "We just want to prevent the Central Valley from being the 'first victim' of this poor planning."

Fukuda is a Kings County homeowner who lives in the proposed route.
